# **MPO UPDATE: FY 2025 - 2026 UPWP**

The FY 2025-26 UPWP is in the process of being developed. The primary large projects included in the draft UPWP are the completion of a minor update of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) and a planning study looking at the feasibility of the Mon Valley Greenspace Coalition's conceptual Greenbelt. The MTP update will be built on the regional travel demand model modifications made for the ongoing Downtown Microsimulation Study and public involvement and corridor evaluations to be made by MPO Staff. Corridors to evaluated include a portion of Brookhaven Road in the vicinity of WV 7. The Greenbelt Feasibility Study will examine the corridors identified in the Greenbelt Conceptual map and as adopted in the MTP. The Study will focus on evaluating the complete street improvements for the on-road portions of the Conceptual Map. The Study will develop planning level cost estimates and prioritization of preferred on road corridors for implementation. It will also identify the preferred locations for proposed off-road facilities to intersect with on-road segments. Additional studies will be needed to determine the feasibility and alignments for off-road facilities. This Study's Complete Street emphasis should make it eligible for 100% Federal funding. The draft UPWP also proposes a 3% COLA for MPO staff.

# PARTNER AGENCY UPDATE: MOUNTAIN LINE



During the early morning hours on January 6 th , 2025, the snow began to fall as Winter Storm Blair made its way through Monongalia County. A State of Emergency was declared as overnight snow accumulations were expected to be around 2-4 inches depending on elevation. Monongalia County schools closed and West Virginia University also canceled its' in person classes for the day. Local outpatients clinics also opted to close their doors to keep as many folks home and off the roads as possible.

While the adverse conditions afforded some the opportunity to work from home or have the day off, many people essential to the Monongalia community had to get to work and Mountain Line was there for them. Mountain Line Transit employees braved the snow of Winter Storm Blair. Thirty-five drivers reported to work that day providing over 600 trips for community members. Together, they drove over 3650 miles, ensuring safe and reliable transportation for the community.

Throughout the day and subsequent days, as Winter Storm Blair amounted as much as 10 inches of snow in Mon County, Mountain Line Transit drivers continued to provide safe and reliable transportation. Aside from a few roads in which conditions were not safely passable, Mountain Line Transit continued to provide transportation throughout the storm without missing any service areas. Mountain Line Transit recognizes the dedication and commitment to service our drivers demonstrated during Winter Storm Blair.

Mountain Line Transit's NewFIT specialized medical transportation program experienced 18% growth in 2024. Of the 1563 trips MLTA provided, 858 were to dialysis clinics. Additional trips include dental visits, doctor visits, vision appointments, therapy appointments as well as routine checkups. This program continues to be supported by the Federal 5310 Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities funding as well as our local partner, The Hazel Ruby McQuain Foundation. Without the continued support of The Foundation, this program would not be available. MRTC looks forward to providing continued specialized medical transportation service for Monongalia County.

RideMon, Mountain Line's micro-transit service also saw a 20% increase in ridership. The RideMon service replaces the Mountain Heights and Grafton Rd routes. Using a mobile app, passengers can request rides without advanced reservations. Riders, who travel within the designated geographical area, can be dropped off without the need for a transfer. Riders who will be traveling outside the geographical area are connected with transit services at one of the three following locations: Retail Circle Walmart, Mountaineer Mall and Sabraton Goodwill.
